
The Individual Research Plan

Research funding

The Individual Research Plan is the most important document prepared by the PhD student during the first year of studies at the doctoral school. It contains a detailed description of the doctoral dissertation project, planned courses and didactic and scientific activities during their education. The submission of the Individual Research Plan within 12 months from the beginning of studies at the doctoral school is a condition for the continuation of those studies, and its implementation shall be evaluated during the mid-term evaluation after 24 months of study (18 for the six-semester mode).

In addition to internal initiatives, PhD students can also benefit from research grants from the National Science Centre, the National Centre for Research and Development, the National Academic Exchange Agency and external programmes.





Mid-term evaluation

The mid-term evaluation is an evaluation of the progress in the implementation of the Individual Research Plan. It is conducted after 24 months of education by an independent evaluation group. During the evaluation, the doctoral student presents the state of

preparation of his/her dissertation and answers questions from the committee. A positive mid-term evaluation is associated with an increase in the amount of the doctoral scholarship, and its negative result results in the termination of education at the doctoral school.

Doctoral commitee

The Doctoral Committee is an advisory and opinion-forming body in the process of preparing the Individual Research Plan and the doctoral thesis. It shall consist of a thesis supervisor, a possible co-supervisor or an auxiliary thesis supervisor and researchers with substantial achievements in the discipline in which the doctorate is being prepared. The members of the Doctoral Committee shall be selected by a doctoral student; in the absence of such selection, the Head of the School shall appoint an evaluation team to perform the duties of the Doctoral Committee in order to give an opinion on the work of the student of the doctoral school.

Thesis supervisor and Auxiliary thesis supervisor

Thesis supervisor is a researcher with at least the degree of dr. hab, under the direction of whom, the doctoral student is preparing his/her doctoral thesis. The supervisor supervises the research, advises on the choice of courses and teaching and scientific careers.

An auxiliary thesis supervisor is a researcher at PhD level (without the right to promote PhD students), but with considerable competences on subjects related to the subject of the doctoral thesis. He/she takes care of the preparation of the doctoral thesis, assists the thesis supervisor in administrative and scientific matters.
